Curriculum News at BPPS

Year R

This term in Year R we have been learning about the gingerbread man. In Literacy we made story maps. In expressive arts and designs we made our own gingerbread man, decorated them and even got to take them home to eat, Yum! In science we conducted science experiments on our gingerbread man. We predicted and tested what would happen when the gingerbread man fell into the river. In busy bee we have explored mixing the gingerbread man into different materials outside.

Year 1

Year 1 have been focusing on significant people in History and in particular they have looked at Grace Darling and have learnt how the RNLI started because of her. In Science, we have been learning about animals and how they can be classified. In particular, whether they are a herbivore, a carnivore or an omnivore as well as looking at the seasons. We have looked closely at how the seasons have changed recently from winter to spring. Ask your child what they can see as signs of spring during the holidays... and maybe you'll spot some of the animals that the children have learnt about in your adventures. We have thoroughly enjoyed learning about Norman the slug with the silly shell in our writing lessons and have linked this to our science topic and really enjoyed looking for slugs in our playground as well. Could you keep an eye out for any mini beasts that you spot during the holidays for the children to tell their teacher about when they're back in school?

Year 2

Spring has arrived! This term Year 2 fully got into the Easter spirit with the arrival of 5 fluffy ducklings. We learnt how we could meet their needs in school, by using incubators, heat pads and food pellets. This allowed us to see our science learning become a reality, as we have been exploring food webs and food chains. By being able to experience the duckling life cycle it gave the children an understanding about our local environment and the animals that are living in this habitat.

We have taken on the role of a soldier during the Crimean War in history, writing a diary to our loved ones about the horrors we have experienced in the hospital.

Although they had to experience these gruesome conditions, we learnt how they would soon be saved by 'The Lady with the Lamp', Florence Nightingale.

Year 2 continued

We have looked at her significant impact in changing hospital conditions for the future generations, if you would like to extend this learning during the holidays, you can visit one of Florence Nightingale's real beds, at Fort Nelson on Portsdown Hill! According to local legends, this half term Year 2 have been transported to a mythical dream land. We have designed our own mythical creatures and created fact files about them. Ask us about how to spot our creature, where it lives and what its unique talents are - which make it a breathtaking sight to behold (if you are fortunate enough to locate it)! During our maths learning this half term we have begun our exploration of money. The children are learning to recognise amounts of coins and how these totals can be made in different ways, using the coins available. We have talked lots about the situations that we could use this learning in real life. Over the holidays can you test us on our knowledge of coins, whilst we are out and about in shops, cafes and experiences?

Year 3

In Year 3 we have been scientists this half term and have been learning about plant life cycles. This included dissecting and labeling a daffodil and growing our own carrots in the classroom. This led to a discussion around our big question: are all plants the same? In maths we have been extending our fraction knowledge, we can identify unit and non unit fractions as well as finding fractions of shapes and numbers. Year 3 loved world book day! We focused on a story called 'Let's Celebrate', this provoked learning and artwork inspired by festivals around the world such as Holi, Carnival and Cherry blossom festival.

Year 4

This half term Year 4 have been exploring the awe and wonder of lost words. The children have created beautiful acrostic poems. They have been investigating the states of matter and rivers in science. They really enjoyed their experiment to find out which state of matter ice cubes melt in the fastest, they were surprised with the results!

Year 5



In Year 5, our budding engineers have been learning about bridges, experimenting with various pillars and arches, as well as evaluating different materials and designs. Working in small groups, our teams have created detailed diagrams of their bridge designs. With excitement building, the children are eager to start building and reflecting on their final creations as the half term comes to a close.

Year 6

In writing, our Year 6 pupils have embraced their inner adventurers, inspired by the gripping narratives of Katherine Rundell's 'The Explorer' and the real-life escapades of survival expert Bear Grylls. They set out to pen their own tales of resilience and ingenuity.

Choosing their own settings, from dense jungles to desolate islands, our young authors concocted thrilling scenarios where protagonists faced daunting challenges. They crafted narratives filled with tension, courage, and the unwavering spirit of survival. From escaping treacherous predators to overcoming natural disasters, each story unfolded a unique problem for their characters to conquer, leaving readers on the edge of their seats.

Our Year 6 mathematicians have been sharpening their skills in area and perimeter; they navigated the complexities of compound shapes. From calculating the area of triangles and parallelograms to determining the perimeter of irregular farmlands, our students showcased their problem-solving skills. Year 6 has also tackled real-world scenarios, applying mathematical concepts to unravel the complexities of shape and space.

During our afternoon learning, our Year 6 scientists explored the inner workings of the human body. Through hands-on investigations and interactive experiments, our budding scientists explored the factors influencing heart rate and the intricate processes of nutrient absorption. From dissecting diagrams to conducting pulse-raising activities, they deepened their biological understanding of the human body with enthusiasm and curiosity.
