## Curriculum News at BPPS

#### Year R

This term we are exploring the traditional tale - The Gingerbread Man. The children have listened to the story and created their own story map. In Foundation, we made our own gingerbread man and decorated them. They were yummy! In Science, we have been learning about predictions. The children explored what would happen to different food products when you add water. The children then made a prediction of what would happen if the gingerbread man jumped into the river. We were excited to discover that the next day the gingerbread men had dissolved into a mushy mess! Ask your child to tell you their favourite part in the story.

#### Year 1

As we enjoy the new Spring 2 term, in maths, place value will be the main focus, with some topic work on shape. Please support your child by reinforcing their number-bonds to 20 (or 50, if able) with calculations using both addition and subtraction. Norman the Silly Slug is a funny fella . . . He's been up to his tricks again and, in our English writing slots, we will be re-writing the story of this mischievous minibeast! (Hint: it's World Book Day on Thurs 7th March . . . !)

Grace Darling is our 'Significant Historical Individual' this half term, and we will be focusing on Animals and the Seasons in Science.

As we approach the Christian festival of Easter, we will explore acts of kindness, happiness and sadness in RE and our Art focus is printing animal patterns, followed on from the related painting unit in the Autumn.

#### Year 2

We have been having an exciting time during our learning journeys across Year 2! In our history lessons, we've been learning about the incredible Florence Nightingale and her pioneering efforts in revolutionising healthcare. We've dived into the pages of history to understand how Florence's dedication and compassion transformed hospitals and nursing practices. Through stories and activities, we've gained a newfound appreciation for her contributions to improving healthcare for all!

## Curriculum News at BPPS

#### **Year 2 Continued**

In our writing sessions, creativity knows no bounds as we crafted our own mythical beasts and we have begun our journey of creating fact files. With imagination as our guide, we've dreamed up fantastical creatures, each with its own unique traits and characteristics. Through this process, we're enhancing our writing skills by learning how to creatively inform and engage our readers. From ferocious dragons to elegant unicorns, our mythical beasts are coming to life on the pages of our fact files.

#### Year 3

In maths Year 3, has been investigating fractions of shape. We have been folding paper to recognise equivalent fractions.

In writing we have been deep diving into the pretentious nature of Edward Tulane, we have been attentively following his miraculous journey. In geography we have been learning about our world and the different climates zones. Year 3 are experts at finding the equator and the countries that have a hot and cold climate!

#### Year 4

We are excited to be back at school for Spring 2! In writing, we have LOVED delving into 'The Lost Words'. We have been showcasing our understanding of verbs, similes and personification as strategies to create an emotive response in our reader. We have really, really enjoyed exploring the acrostic poems in the book as well as the beautiful illustrations.

For the next term we are exploring rivers in geography! We have been enjoying learning new vocabulary linked to describe the key features of rivers, as well as identifying these in the UK. We have zoomed into our local area and started to delve deeper into the River Itchen too! We are loving our geography lessons!

## Curriculum News at BPPS



#### Year 5

In our art lessons, Year 5 have been creating some fantastic abstract final pieces using printing tiles! Our work was influenced by Picasso and Andy Warhol, and the children really enjoyed getting stuck in and designing their own printing tile which was then used to create contrast using paint. The outcomes were outstanding it was wonderful to see how they took inspiration from two famous artists to create their final outcome!

In maths, the children have been expanding their knowledge of fractions. We have explored the key mathematical vocabulary for fractions to deepen their knowledge and apply it to finding equivalent fractions and converting between improper and mixed. It has been fantastic to see how the children have grappled with some tricky concepts! We will now be moving on furthering their knowledge in fractions by adding, subtracting and multiplying.

#### Year 6

In Maths, we have been embarking on a journey of logical reasoning and problem-solving. Through algebraic expressions and equations, we have been learning to decipher patterns, generalise rules and make connections between numbers and symbols. Going forward, we will be engaging with variables in order to foster a deeper understanding of mathematical concepts.

During our science lessons, Year 6 have been exploring Charles Darwin's theory of natural selection and have gained insights into the diversity of species and the interconnectedness of life. They have also traced the adaptations of organisms over time and have gained an understanding of the mechanisms driving evolutionary change. We couldn't quite believe some of the incredible changes species have gone through over the course of millions of years!
