A two-minute silence was observed at 11 o'clock on Friday, 11<sup>th</sup> November. We offered our prayers for all who serve, or have served, in the forces and their families. The children spent some time in school reflecting on a virtual workshop that took place on Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> November, thinking about the story behind one of the world's most famous poems, In Flanders Fields, and its links to the poppy as a symbol of commemoration. They learnt about what the different coloured poppies represent and designed a new style of Remembrance poppy with a specific focus, thinking about those who fought and lost their lives during the war and honouring their memory. These poppies were all put together to form a Remembrance Display in school and you can see the photo of this on our school blog on the website.

# **Curriculum and Enrichment**

The children are very much looking forward to their visit to the Mayflower Theatre (KS2) and Big Foot Musical Theatre (in school KS1) for exciting pantomime performances to get us all in the spirit of Christmas.

# Year R

In Year R this term, we have been thinking about Diwali. We have immersed ourselves in the festival of light! We have a brand new home corner that allows us to dress up and celebrate! During Writing, we havebeen using our new phonics knowledge to write words and phrases about Diwali including Rama and Sita.

In Expressive Arts and Design, we have created playdough to make our very own Diva Lamp. To mirror this, we have learnt to mix our primary colours to create secondary colours. We made beautiful firework pictures. In Maths, we are focusing on our number to 10 while developing our formation, counting and ordering skills.

## Year 1

In Autumn 2, Year 1 have been learning about....

Maths: We have been finishing our additional learning, recapping some of our place value and most recently have been working out subtraction. This has involved using part - part whole models, number lines to count back and crossing out. We have been experts at this, no one can stop us now we are subtraction Superheroes.

Writing: We have read the wonderful story Norman, the slug with a silly shell. Our journey start by looking at adjectives and comparing the different object oppositions he could use for a shell. We even tried some of them on as a shell, we had to test it to make sure it was only the very best for Norman! We then wrote our final piece outlining which we found to be the best option for Norman. We have also looked at the poem Chocolate Cake by Michael Rossen. We have been acting this out, linking this to our seasonal knowledge to create our own mini poems.

Topic: In geography, we have been learning about our local area. We have explored the world in which we live and discovered what our Country, the closest city, and Town are!

In Science, we received a message from the fourth little pig- He needed our help! Percy needs help in building a house to prevent the wolf from getting to him. We decided it needs to be secure, safe and warm in this cold, wet winter weather. To help him we have been learning all about different objects and their materials, helping us to consider what material would be best for different parts of the house and why. We have learnt lots of key words to help us make the decision, absorbency, transparent, opaque.

#### Year 2

In Year 2 we have done some excellent writing to create our own versions of the Rainbow Fish story using adjectives and adverbs. We have done lots of exploring in the Rainforest looking into animals and the different layers, as well as investigating other habitats in Science. Did you know that a polar bear has blubber to keep it warm? We are very passionate about protecting the Rainforest and Year 2 have learnt some super facts about why the Rainforest is so important!

#### Year 3

Year 3 have had an amazing term so far! In writing, we have been exploring 'The Twits' and writing our own additional chapter to the story where Mr Twit gets revenge! We have been thinking of revolting tricks from our trick shop and illustrating these characters' devious nature. In maths, we have been learning how to use column addition and subtraction and applying these to real life scenarios to deepen our understanding. We have been thoroughly enjoying our learning in history on Walter Tull. We have been learning about his early life, career as a professional football player and his life as a soldier in World War 1. We have been able to link this back to our prior learning on significant people across history such as Florence Nightingale!

#### Year 4

We have been busy recount writing this half term! The children have impressed us by writing exhilarating pieces based on the book 'My Brother is a Superhero!' In maths, our main focus has been subtraction whilst developing our confidence with a range of written methods. In history, Year 4 has enjoyed learning facts about the impact that The Roman Empire made on Britain including architecture, bathing and The Celts. We were lucky to be visited from the University of Southampton to participate in a workshop related to our electricity science topic as well! What a busy half term so far.

## Year 5

In English, the children have been writing persuasive pieces on the magic, mystery and importance of our ocean and the devastating effects that plastic pollution is currently having on it. In their maths lessons, Year 5 have been focusing on the skills of multiplication and division. So far, they have learnt about factors and multiples, and have applied our knowledge through a variety of challenging activities.

## Year 6

As part of our Remembrance learning, we were lucky to join a Zoom session led by 'Big Ideas' and The Maple Leaf Trust. Along with other schools in the partnership and the UK we learned the moving story of John McCrae and marked the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of his birth. We listened to and read his famous poem, *In Flanders Fields*, and explored its links to the poppy as a symbol of commemoration. The children were challenged to design a new style of Remembrance poppy with a specific focus. Examples included: blue for the navy, green for the wildlife and nature affected and white for the children who lost parents. Later in the week we brought our designs to life ready to add to a whole-school display.

## Year R Pip and Pap Phonics

In year R we have learnt all of our orange phase sounds. The children are now working on applying their phonic knowledge and blending sounds to read rocket words! The children are very excited to explore the digraphs and trigraphs in Pink phase this term.

Year R parents have very much enjoyed attending our Friday Pip and Pap Phonics workshops learning with their children.

#### **Rotary Shoe Box Appeal**

A very big thank you to all families who filled a Rotary Club shoe box full of gifts to share with children in need this Christmas. We collected **172** "family shoeboxes" this year! They were collected by the Rotary Club who will ensure the shoeboxes reach children in Eastern Europe in time for Christmas. Many thanks for your continued support and generosity.

#### Scholastic Book Fair
