Target Setting Meetings

We hope you all had a good summer. As a school, we are keen to share as much information with you about your child's learning as possible. In the Autumn Term, we would like to share with you your child's learning targets and targets for progress this academic year, with a face to face meeting with your child's class teacher.

We set targets in the Autumn Term and then track the children throughout the year to ensure that they are making 'at least good' progress across the whole curriculum.

We send a detailed report for all children in March. This allows a mid-year exploration of progress to be shared with parents as well as any development points for the remainder of the year. We also report on social, emotional development and Foundation Learning. At the end of the year, we have a summative pupil progress update including outcomes and attendance. Parents are invited to parent teacher meetings alongside all reporting.

In addition to measuring the breadth of children's progress, teacher discussion will also be around the depth of their learning. Your child will / should be present for these meetings and books will be shared to demonstrate targets for their learning journey.

Our target meetings will be held on the following days from 12 – 4:30pm:

Monday 16th October – Year 1 Tuesday 17th October – Year 5 Wednesday 18th October – Year 6 Thursday 19th October – Year 3 & 4 Friday 20th October – Year 2

Appointment slots will be made active via Tucasi from 2pm on Wednesday 4th October, this is the only way appointments can be booked. Please sign up to SCO Pay if you have not already done so. The

office can support with this, should you need any help.

If you have siblings and would like to arrange your appointments for the same day, please do speak to the class teachers where a mutually agreeable can be arranged if required.

This is an adaptation to previous years and welcome any feedback once meetings have taken place. We know from research that engaged parents who help their children learn make a significant impact on their outcomes. We welcome your commitment and look forwards to working in partnership with you, so that we can support your child to be the best they can be.
