**Dear Parents**

#### After School Clubs

It has been fantastic to welcome back our afterschool clubs. Clubs will be running throughout the academic year on a termly basis. We have allocated every child a space within one or more of their chosen clubs following submission of the form in either term 1 or term 2.

We have tried to provide an opportunity for all children to take part in a club, with a minimum of one child's choice in order to be fair. We have organised a waiting list for oversubscribed clubs. Please can I remind <u>all parents</u> that after school clubs finish at <u>4:30pm promptly</u>. Thank you.

### Allergies

We have a number of children and staff with severe nut allergies. With this in mind, we do not have any nuts or nut products at snack time or in packed lunches. These include peanut butter, Nutella or Pesto (which contains Pine nuts). These can be a major cause of anaphylactic shock in some adults and children. Your care and support in this is greatly appreciated.



### Uniform

A big thank you to all parents who have sent their children in the correct uniform. Our children are looking very smart. Uniform is an important part of our culture and our children certainly look very proud to be part of the BPP family.

We politely ask parents **not** to send their children to school wearing unsuitable shoes, eg trainers or boots – warm/welly boots can be worn at playtimes but sensible shoes inside please. School is very well heated, making boot wearing indoors, all day inappropriate. We also please ask that the children bring in their bookbags each day and not backpacks as the corridors become congested when they end up on the floor. Please also ensure the current PE kit is available - clothes/sportswear with slogans, popstars or football club logos are not for school. Thank you.

### Start and end of the day

At the start of the day children can enter the building from 8.20am for an 8.30am start to our day.

In order to ensure the safe handover of children at the end of the day, please put in writing any alternative adult you give permission to, to collect your child/children and give to the school office. Teachers will be teaching and may not remember slips of paper and new instructions.

## School meals

We encourage all of our children to have a hot school dinner, whether they are infants or juniors.

We have worked very closely with the school council, children and our caterers to ensure that the food offered is home cooked and delicious. We regularly chop meals off the menu and add new tastier options. All of our teachers eat a school dinner. We have a third `Jacket potato with filling' option for those who do not like our meat or vegetarian option. I can assure you that our cooks are wonderful and I look forward to a school dinner every day! Please do consider this as a filling option to support your child's learning in the afternoon. If your child is going to arrive late to school and they wish to have a cooked meal at lunchtime, we would be grateful if you could let the office know in advance by telephone. Unfortunately, if your child arrives after 9.30am, and we have not been notified, your child will receive a "spare" meal. Always best to be on time, or phone ahead. Thank you.

# Safety Reminder!

A gentle reminder, please can you ensure your child/ren <u>do not play</u> on the play equipment (play trails/trail area) before or after school. They are not suitable for use without school supervision. We also ask that children or adults do not ride bikes and scooters on the school playgrounds.

We again politely remind you that dogs are not permitted on the school site – this includes being held in arms. Thank you.

# Parking

We are sadly still getting reports from local residents of inconsiderate parking or dangerous driving at school drop off and pick up times on Manor Farm Road and River View Road. In particular people are still using the Care Home on River View Road to park or turn. Please be mindful if you need to use your car for the school run. Local residents are advised to contact the Civil Enforcement Officers or the police if they have concerns.

# School Messages

As ours is a large and busy school, please note that the office cannot guarantee that messages received after 3.00pm will be delivered in time for the end of the school day. Please plan as far in advance as you can, as we want to keep our children safe and last minute messages can be lost in the melee of the end of day.
